

Continuing Education, Support and Maintenance of Qualification for Accredited KAI Practitioners

New qualified KAI Practitioners are welcomed into the global KAI community. The community contains people actively working in a wide range of applications of KAI – including people & team development programs/consultation, research from neuroscience to diversity management, in the military through manufacturing, to mention just a few. Additionally, there is an exciting range of KAI events and opportunities to meet, discuss, develop and learn.

All Practitioners are Standard Bearers

All KAI Practitioners and Master Practitioners have invested significant resources into becoming qualified. Anyone who is qualified and using the KAI inventory is ‘carrying the flag’ for all other KAI practitioners, as well as themselves. Therefore, it is important to everyone in the KAI community, that all Practitioners work to best practice, do no harm and remain abreast of new developments.

How is this done?

To ensure that our Practitioners are up-to-date, safe and knowledgeable, we require that in the first four years after initial accreditation, that they are actively involved with the worldwide KAI community and continue developing/deepening their KAI knowledge.

Every Practitioner has a different type of practice and use of the KAI, so a ‘one-size-fits-all’ program isn’t suitable. Therefore, there are different options available, and you are free to choose the combination which suits your interests, needs, time-constraints and budget.

Every year, there is an interesting and wide range of options for you to choose from, to help you in your practice. These range from 90-minute webinars of interesting topics, attending our annual symposium, undertaking research & publishing, through to become a KAI Master Practitioner.

Each activity has a different weighting (in points), and you **require eight (8) points** to be acquired over your first four years of practice.

Points to be earned are allocated as shown in the table below:

Points	Activity
8	Become a Master Practitioner, by attending a KAI Masterclass Workshop
4	Publish a peer-reviewed journal article or Presentation (and attendance) at KAI Symposium
2	Attendance at KAI Symposium
1	Attendance of a KAI Practitioner Webinar or Participation in a KAI Mentorship Program
<i>One-by-one basis</i>	Presentation of a portfolio of evidence of practice. The portfolio ‘value’ will be negotiated on an individual basis

Note. Eight points are required within the first four years of KAI accreditation to maintain active status.



Becoming a Master Practitioner

Becoming a KAI Master Practitioner is by invitation, and the KAI Foundation will contact you when you become eligible to attend. It is an exciting 2-day workshop, where Practitioners share their experiences, experienced KAI tutors go into more depth on interesting uses of the instrument, new KAI products/ services are shared, and new research & applications is shared. It is a great opportunity to meet other high-level, experienced and skilled KAI Practitioners from around the world and from different sectors.

Webinars

Topics are very wide, from improve your application in specific areas (e.g. in Leadership), improving interpretation of scores, presentation of case studies, 'ask the expert' panels, through to sales & marketing support.

Symposium

This is an annual event, early in the calendar year. It is a great opportunity to network with co-professionals, listen to case studies and applications in the 'real world', hear about new and groundbreaking research and have an update of 'all things KAI'.

Post 1st Four Years of Accreditation

Participation in KAI Events after the initial four years of being a KAI Practitioner is encouraged, but not required for maintenance of your accreditation.

Lapsed Accreditation

Your KAI accreditation is said to be lapsed, if you certificated in or before 2017 and have not attended an Advanced Workshop or Masterclass. It will also lapse, if you qualified during or after 2018, and have not acquired your 8 points, as indicated above.

If KAI accreditation has lapsed, please negotiate with the KAI Course Teaching Team. Requirements will be assessed on an individual basis, but it is likely to include refreshing knowledge of KAI.
